# **Training Camp**



Certain members of the general public are becoming more interested in Freemasonry. We have welcomed several men who simply walked in the door on a Thursday evening, hoping to learn what the Craft is all about.

Several of those men return regularly to our Stated Meeting dinners to enjoy good food and make new friends.

And a few of them ask to join Friendship Lodge. That's always an exciting moment. When an application for the degrees appears, it sets off a series of activities.

First, we read the application at the next Stated Meeting, so the members know that we have a new applicant. It gives them a chance to ask questions about him. And they have an opportunity to object to receiving the application. Objections are rare but they have happened.

If there was no objection, the Secretary enters the applicant's information into iMember. That action triggers the Grand Lodge's Membership Department to begin a background investigation. Since that requirement was added a few years ago, nobody applying to Friendship Lodge has failed to pass.

But the investigation does occasionally reveal a negative record of some kind. If there was an incident of "moral turpitude", the applicant is automatically disqualified. The applicant has an opportunity appeal the decision and show that he is indeed worthy to become a Mason.

If there was something like an arrest or misdemeanor in this record, the lodge is informed and allowed to decide whether to proceed. For example, if an applicant, in his youth, participated in and anti-war protest at which he was arrested but never tried or convicted of a crime, the lodge might decide that he was merely standing up for what he believed, and choose to accept him.

At some point, the Master assigns an investigating committee of three Master Masons to visit the applicant in his home, meet his wife and family if he has them, observe how he lives, and learn more about him. The investigators seek to answer one question: "Would this gentleman make a good member of Friendship Lodge.

The investigators do not know who each other is, nor do the officers or the lodge know who they are. This way, each investigator is free from outside pressure when he makes his recommendation.

Since I joined Friendship Lodge, I do not recall any investigating committee recommend against an applicant joining our lodge.

The next step is to vote on the application in the next Stated Meeting. The vote is taken via anonymous ballot. Once again, each Brother can vote without feeling pressure from anybody else. If the ballot in unanimous in the affirmative, the applicant has been elected. We change his classification to candidate.

What happens if a member votes against? We do the ballot over again to correct a possible mistake. If somebody votes against a second time, the applicant is rejected. And he must wait a year before he can reapply to receive the degrees is a Masonic lodge.

Now the Master checks the calendar and schedules a tentative date for the candidate's First Degree. It is tentative until the candidate informs the lodge that he is available and will be present on that date.

Next, the Master asks the Officers Coaches whether the officers are prepared to confer the First Degree. It's the Coaches' job to make sure that they are. And if any officer is unavailable on the degree date, the Master is responsible to arrange for a substitute. It's also the Coaches' job to make sure there is somebody available as a substitute officer.

Getting your First Degree is a big event. Among other things, it is an initiation into Freemasonry. That means a regular guy went in and an Entered Apprentice Mason came out. Although it may not be immediately apparent, but receiving his First Degree marked an important milestone in that man's life. It started him on the path of self-

improvement to become a better man, husband, employee, business owner, citizen, church member, and whatever else he be or do.

After receiving his degree, the new Entered Apprentice has material to learn. First, he must memorize a portion of the ritual through which he has passed. This requirement forces him to contemplate and remember what took place and what he agreed to do.

To help him, the Senior Warden appoints a coach to befriend and guide the new Mason. Friendship Lodge gives the top-line signer of the application form the first choice of being that candidate's coach. In most cases the top-line signer is willing and available, so he accepts the job.

The role of a Candidate Coach is not limited to teaching the candidate to memorize portions of the ritual from his degree. Most candidates are introduced to what is for them unfamiliar concepts and terminology. The coach helps the candidate understand what happened and what it signifies and helps him apply those lessons to his own life.

There is more. The new Mason is required to study and take an exam. We used to have printed booklets for that. But now we do it all online. You can review those lessons and take the exams at the Candidate Learning Center on the Grand Lodge website. All you do is log in to iMember, click My Portal and then click Education.

For many years, we required newly initiated, passed, and raised Masons to write an essay about a certain part of their degrees. Doing that is no longer required, since the online learning has proven to be a better experience.

Of course, if the new Mason wanted to write an essay, we would certainly give him the opportunity to read it as part of his ritual proficiency, which is done during an open lodge meeting.

You may ask, "Why would the Officers Coach be concerned with coaching candidates? The answer is everything we do is about the candidates. That's what it takes to turn a man into a Mason. He must learn things and demonstrate his understanding. He supplies the desire, we supply the direction.

# The Secretary's Table



Everybody is getting tired of the Secretary harping about dues. Especially those who pay promptly each year. So this month, I will talk about something else: iMember.

#### **Setting up Your iMember Account**

To open your iMember account, you need your **Member ID** number. Your Member ID number appears on your dues card or dues invoice. Or contact your lodge secretary or the Grand Lodge member services team at

memberservices@freemason.org.

To create your iMember account:

- 1. Log in to <u>freemason.org</u>.
- 2. In the upper right corner, click **Member Sign** In.
- 3. Beneath the Sign In box, click **Sign Up**.
- 4. In the Membership Registration box, type your:
  - Lodge number
     If you belong to more than one lodge, type just one lodge number.
  - Member ID
  - Last Name

Then click Check Membership Status.


- 5. In the Register box, type your:
  - Email address
  - Password (two times)
     Your password must be at least 8 characters.

Then click Sign Up.

6. In the Sign In box, type your email address and password, then click **Sign In**.

You are now logged in to your iMember account.

This is your iMember Portal. Look at all the things you have access to!



**Feed** — Read posts with the latest news and announcements regarding the California lodges.

**Events** — Calendar for your lodge and any groups you belong to.

**My Profile** — View your Masonic record, change your personal information, iMember password, designate an online payment method, and activate automatic dues payments.

Virtual Card — Download and print your current dues card.

**Education** — Candidates and Lodge Management Program students access study materials and exams.

**Grand Lodge** — Request an event on the Grand Lodge calendar, Grand Lodge contact information, view the Grand Master's itinerary, subscribe to the Grand Master's calendar, view and download lists of Grand Lodge officers, Boards, Committees, Inspectors, living Past Grand Masters and Elected Officers.

**Grand Lodge Recognition** — View or download the list of Grand Lodges around the world that are recognized by the Grand Lodge of California, and obtain their contact information.

**Member Search** — You type his name, iMember returns his contact information and Masonic record.

**Seminars** — Recorded seminars on Masonic organizational topics.

**Find Meetings** — View a list of Lodge stated meetings near you or near a location that you designate. Includes distance, meeting place, and contact information.

**Lodge Locator** — Search for California lodges by name, county or district number. Includes a map with contact information and directions.

**Resources** — Instructions, manuals, handbooks, procedures, instructions, regulations, documents, and forms of every kind. Note: Printed manuals are available from Los Angeles Fraternal Supply Company. A link is included.

**Candidate Coach** — If you are a Candidate Coach, this panel lists the candidates assigned to you and their personal, masonic, and contact information.

**Leadership Retreats** — For Masters, Wardens, Treasurers, Secretaries, and any brother interested in learning more about lodge planning, management, and development.

Friendship Lodge No. 210 — View your payment history, lodge information, a roster of active lodge members, view and post items on the lodge's feed.
