Applications for Friendship Lodge scholarships were due by July 22 this year. But we will accept them as late as July 29.

To apply for a scholarship, the recipient must submit:

- 1. A statement explaining why he/she is applying for the scholarship includes his or her home address, email address, and telephone number.
- 2. A letter of recommendation from their father, grandfather, or great-grandfather who must be a Master Mason in good standing of Friendship Lodge No. 210.
- 3. A letter of recommendation from one other Master Mason in good standing of any regular Masonic Lodge.
- 4. Proof of enrollment in the upcoming semester or quarter shows the list of classes and the number of units being taken. If such evidence is unavailable at the time of application, the applicant shall provide a written statement of explanation.
- 5. A complete copy of all their:
 - a. High School academic records for the last two (2) years showing GPA, or
 - b. Post-high school academic records for the last three (3) quarters or two (2) semesters. For post-high school education, printouts from the school's website are sufficient.

6. All of the requested information must be provided. Incomplete applications or applications received after the due date are not eligible for the scholarship award in the current calendar year.

- Emailed to the Master, Wor. Gilbert Cruz at <u>gilbertzc@aol.com</u>. All emailed documents *must* be in PDF file format.
- Hand delivered to the Wor. Gilbert Cruz before July 30, 2024.
- 7. A list of scholarships and other student financial aid awards he/she is currently receiving and for which he/she has been are approved.

Child ID

Friendship Lodge has been providing Child ID services since the program began decades ago.

Our most recent service was at the Chandler-Tripp School spring carnival on May 31. We provided 12 child ID sheets at that event.

Child ID itself was a custom software package created for the Grand Lodge of California's program to help prepare families in the event that one of the children went missing. It was a big leap forward and no doubt brought many kids home.

But things have changed. Child ID fell out of favor and was not upgraded with newer technologies. In time, support for it was dropped completely and the Grand Lodge no longer promoted it.

With the rise of the Internet, protocols for finding lost children have improved substantially. As a result, the low-resolution portrait and thumb-print images produced by the Child ID system have become obsolete.

What will we do? What will it cost? Those are questions we are considering now. Your input and suggestions will be greatly appreciated.

Sciots Cornerstone Award

This year, Friendship Lodge was pleased to nominate Bro. Mike Smith to receive the Sciots Cornerstone Award.

The Ancient Egyptian Order of Sciots is an optional organization that any Master Mason may join. They began as a social group in San Francisco in 1905. The next year, after the great earthquake, the Sciots raised funds to repair and rebuild the local Masonic lodges damaged by the quake.

The Cornerstone award is a way for the Sciots to help local lodges show recognition and appreciation for their hardest working members.

Once a year, each of the lodges in the South Bay Area may nominate one member for the Cornerstone award. But you don't just submit a name. The nomination must be justified. That was not a difficult task in Bro. Mike's case.

The Cornerstone award itself is golden plaque placed on a gold-painted concrete paver that weighs about 7 pounds. Without a doubt, it is the *heaviest* award a Mason can receive.


The Academy is open from 9:30 AM to 5:00 PM. You may arrive at your convenience. Onsite food service is available until 4:00 PM.
